H.—IIII—A comprehensive account of the imajor floods which have roared through the fertile Plo Grande Valley to devasiate several towns and hundreds of acres of crops was obtained to-day by the United Press and the Albuquerque State Tribune which sent an airplane over the stricken area.

It is a story of enormous destruction, of ruined homes and desperae workers.

The Rio Puerce and Salada Rivers, ordinarily dry, filinty creekbeds, were raging forrents, pouring their munich waters into the already overflowing Rio Grande which staggers down through the winding vailey.

Following this discovery, fires broke out in a national forest in Mariposa County. Rangers and firepots' were used by the incendiary to start the blazes. These consisted of candles piaced in cans with oil-soaked rags. Several of these "lirepots" were found.
Two fires declared to be started by an incendiary did damage in Tuolumne County last week estimated at between \$50,000 and \$75,000. Twelve thousand seres were burned over: dwellings, mining properties and barns were consumed.
